#### PRESENTATION/DISCUSSION—PART I

#### A) 2009-2010 Audit Report, Findings and Recommendations

Presenter: Ben Leavitt, Auditor from Christy White Accountancy Corporation

Mr. Leavitt summarized the Audit Report's 14 findings and recommendations, and stated that 7 of the findings from last year have been implemented from last year to this year, which is a good step forward and he hopes that trending will continue with the findings they made this year.

Superintendent Fernandez commented that the district may not have taken recommendations seriously in the past, but they take them very seriously now.

#### B) 2009-2010 Audit Report, Findings and Recommendations of Measure CV Bond Building Fund

Presenter: Ben Leavitt, Auditor from Christy White Accountancy Corporation

Mr. Leavitt reported 2 primary findings rendered from this report: first is the recommendation to improve internal controls over expenditures for Measure CV funds; second is to hire a Facilities Director responsible for monitoring the Measure CV construction program.

Superintendent Fernandez commented that the district will be flying a position at the February board meeting for a Maintenance & Operations Director and will be hiring a Facilities Director as well.

**Erika Espinoza,** Leuzinger High School representative, reported the following: first Multi-Cultural Night with over 250 people in attendance, raised over \$1,000 to go towards prom and lower the cost for students to attend; this Saturday, Leuzinger will host the California Cash for College Workshop; whiteboards and tutoring during 6<sup>th</sup> period; last week had a basketball game with the Faculty vs. Power 106.

Amy Lopez, Hawthorne High School representative, reported the following: winter sports are underway and both boys' basketball and soccer won their last games; semester ends next week; CAHSEE testing is from Feb. 7-8; AP testing for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grades is starting; upcoming formal winter dance and sports rally.

Chantal Alatorre, Lawndale High School representative, reported the following: students have been concerned with the chain linked fence that is up, it causes students to be tardy and makes it very difficult to get to classes; had their winter formal; have Cardinal Friday's where students wear school attire; ASB created a schedule that they are waiting to have approved; had a "Matchmaker" fundraiser with an online program that matches students to potential friends or dates for the upcoming Valentine's day.

#### 10. ITEMS FROM CVSTA/CTA

**Betty Setterlund**, CVSTA president, asked that Item 15C be pulled from the agenda so that they can first ratify the agreement before getting it approved by the board. She also addressed Item 16J, asking the board not to establish the new position due to lack of funding since the teachers haven't been able to receive any raises for three years. Ms. Setterlund asked that board members and the superintendent return her phone calls and emails.

#### 11. COMMENTS FROM BOARD

Board member **Sandra Suarez** reported the following: attended the Leuzinger Multi-Cultural Night and said it is improved and very well-done; she thanked Howard Ho for his efforts; attended the Hawthorne High play and was very impressed and can't wait for the next one.

Board member Gloria Ramos apologized for being late and stated that everyone needs to work as a team.

Board clerk **Maritza Molina** commented that the play at Hawthorne High was extraordinary. She also apologized to Betty Setterlund for not getting back to her.

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#### **COMMENTS FROM BOARD** (Continued)

Board vice-president **Rocio Pizano** reported the following: She was sorry to have missed the play at Hawthorne; she did a walk-thru at the Leuzinger construction site and thinks it will be great; she did a walk-thru of the Performing Arts Center with Mr. Rojas and is excited and knows it will benefit everyone for a long time. Ms. Pizano addressed Betty Setterlund's comment saying that she has never disrespected any union rep in public or in private and is willing to work with other union reps but not Ms. Setterlund.

Board president **Hugo Rojas** reported the following: Assemblyman Bradford will host the Cash for College Workshop at Leuzinger this weekend; Pow-Wow event is coming up in February at Lawndale High School; attended the tour of Baldwin Park School District with Ms. Suarez and learned some things that could benefit our district.

#### 12. COMMENTS FROM SUPERINTENDENT

Superintendent **Jose Fernandez** discussed the Meals for the Needy bill; the Department of Finance will be a hurdle. There are earmarks in Washington DC that he and the board will try to get for the academies, totaling over \$400,000. Meetings with Raytheon have been going on to assist the Engineering Academy. Mr. Fernandez thanked Mr. Rojas and Ms. Suarez for the feedback from Baldwin Park School District stating that he personally spoke with their superintendent and got contact information for the acid wash company that cleans their restrooms. He stated that he has had some open and frank conversations recently with Ms. Setterlund and that will lead to positive action; communication is productive and it starts with respect.

#### 13. PRESENTATION/DISCUSSION - PART II

#### A) Food Services and M&O Update

Presenter: Ron Hacker

Mr. Hacker gave a detailed PowerPoint presentation giving updates on the Food Services department and Maintenance and Operations. Food Services has come a long way in the past 2 years, and is now functioning off making all food as opposed to purchasing processed food so it has been cost effective as well as healthier for the students. New nutrition requirements are being rolled out over the next few years, it may take a while to transition, but we'll get there. Regarding Maintenance and Operations, a big challenge is that many students are enrolling at Lawndale High School and the school was never equipped to handle that many students. Another challenge is Leuzinger High cafeteria and the fact that its deteriorating, it will be difficult until the new cafeteria is ready. Mr. Hacker explained that having outside contractors for everything, i.e., plumbing, electrical, etc. is not efficient and he is putting processes in place to move towards hiring internal positions so that all these bills are not contracted which is not cost effective.

#### B) PowerPoint presentation "Expanding on the Career Academy Model"

Presenters: Laurel Fretz, Dr. Mark Newell, Hatha Parrish

The above presentation was tabled for the next meeting.

#### C) Let's Play Hollywood

Presenters: Maria Eborn, IBA Coordinator and Diane Host, CEO, Let's Play Hollywood Foundation (The above Item was presented at the beginning of Presentation-Part II.)

Ms. Eborn gave a brief introduction to the Let's Play Hollywood Foundation and introduced the CEO, Ms. Host who spoke about the foundation and the possible partnership with Centinela Valley Union HSD. She also introduced and brought up her two partners to speak about the foundation and their roles.

#### D) Review of the 2011 Governor's Budget

Presenters: Eric Hall of Eric Hall & Associates and James Pham, Assistant Superintendent, Business Services Eric Hall, experienced school district financial advisor, spoke about the 2011 Governor's Budget, summarizing the budget cuts and what it amounts to dollar per student cuts. Explained that facilities funding does not look good, no bond measures for 2012, and no sale of existing bonds. He briefly gave background and report of the financial crisis in California. Recommended continuing to be more self-sustaining and self-sufficient, prioritizing because programs will need to be cut, collaborating with sister-school districts and doing whatever you can to have things pay for themselves. Focus on attendance and keeping the rate high and recovery programs and the district is doing a great job of that. He commended Mr. Hacker because at one time the general fund was supporting food services and now it is funding itself. Early retirement incentive programs would be great and the district should be encouraging those near retirement to do so early.

#### D) Review of the 2011 Governor's Budget (Continued)

Mr. Hall stated that he encourages the district to continue to have that liaison with Washington, DC and Sacramento; investing in yourself, being self-sustaining and doing what you can to control your own destiny is really what counts and he encourages the district to continue working on those things. Assistant Superintendent of Business Services **James Pham** spoke about district-specific numbers, summarizing what is projected for the next few years.

Superintendent Fernandez commented that we must be very creative and not ask for help from anybody.

### E) Discussion on Use of Public School Facilities by School Personnel for Non-School Related Activities

Discussants: CVUHSD Board of Education

Superintendent Fernandez asked Ben Leavitt, Auditor from Christy White Accountancy Corp., to give his opinion on the issue of board use of school facilities, which he reported that most school districts run with the superintendent as the barrier between the district employees and the school board; he concluded that in general, direct access for a board member to a school facility does generate concerns because it doesn't isolate the board from direct contact with district employees. A lengthy conversation took place regarding the Memorabilia Committee's exclusive use of a Leuzinger High School classroom and the fact that Ms. Suarez was the only person with a key until recently when the locks were changed and the key given only to school administration to administer access to the room, for not only the Memorabilia Committee but other groups who chose to use the room. Superintendent Fernandez asked Phil Henderson, attorney from Orbach, Huff & Suarez, to give his opinion, who concluded that he would need time to research and put together a formal legal opinion on the matter.
