LEUZINGER GRADUATE OFF TO VANDERBILT UNIVERSITY - FULL SCHOLARSHIP



Julian White is a graduating senior from Leuzinger High School and he is on his way to Vanderbilt University in Nashville, Tennessee. He placed in the top 4% of African American students taking the PSAT in the nation. Because of his accomplishment, he was nominated for the National Merit Scholars Scholarship program. His PSAT score and his grade-point average at Leuzinger earned him a \$59,500 per year scholarship from the University. He wants to major in Electrical Engineering and minor in Patent Law. He wants to be an attorney and he also wants to be an engineer, so he is going to pursue both.

Julian's life was filled with challenges. He was born in Belize and was shot in the chest by a stray bullet when he was only 10 years old. His family moved to California to get away from the violence of his country. His mother committed suicide, and his grandmother died, so Julian said he focused all his energy on school. He was determined to keep working hard and study so he could be successful. He not only excelled in school he is also an excellent athlete, playing basketball and running track. He says that when people find out that he received a scholarship, they ask him if he received it in sports, he answers, "No, **I got an academic scholarship for my brain!**"

Julian also helped his fellow students at Leuzinger as a Peer College Counselor. He said that math always came easy to him and when he saw a fellow student struggling, he felt it was his duty to help them with their work. He said he would tell incoming freshman to **"stay focused, have fun, it is possible to succeed."**

He stopped by the district office to say farewell to CVUHSD and brought his little brother, Jemuel, who is visiting from Belize this summer. Jemuel is so proud of his "big" brother, he says he has got big footsteps to follow and Julian is truly his **real life hero.**

COUGAR ACADEMY

A new "School within a School" is opening at Hawthorne High School. It is called the "Cougar Academy". The program is being made available to Hawthorne students via a unique partnership between Cougar Academy and another "school within a school" type program, the Navy Junior Officer Training Corps (NJROTC) program.



Students Physical Education, character growth and other life skills training will be delivered by two Naval Science instructors (NSI's) in a team teaching environment. Senior Chief David Yancy and Chief Pedro Martinez have over 55 years of combined experience in training young people in taking on new challenges and accomplishing life goals.

The students will enjoy a "special dual status"; they will be Cougar Academy Students/Cadets. Once a year, they will participate in the California Fitness Gram and the NJROTC Navy-wide Physical Fitness Test (PFT). They will even have the opportunity to compete in traditional school sports (with qualifying academic standing) or NJROTC Athletic Meet competitions.
